

# FROM COURT TO COURT

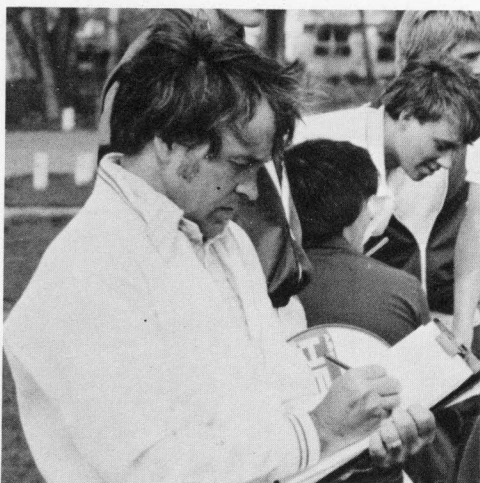

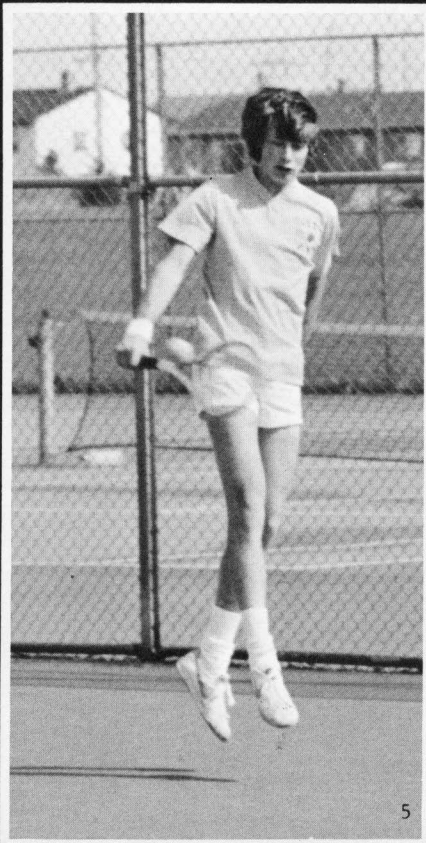
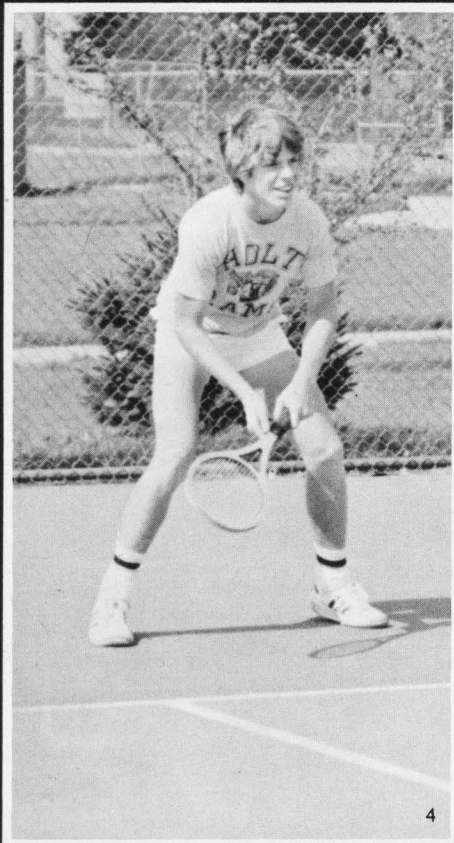
