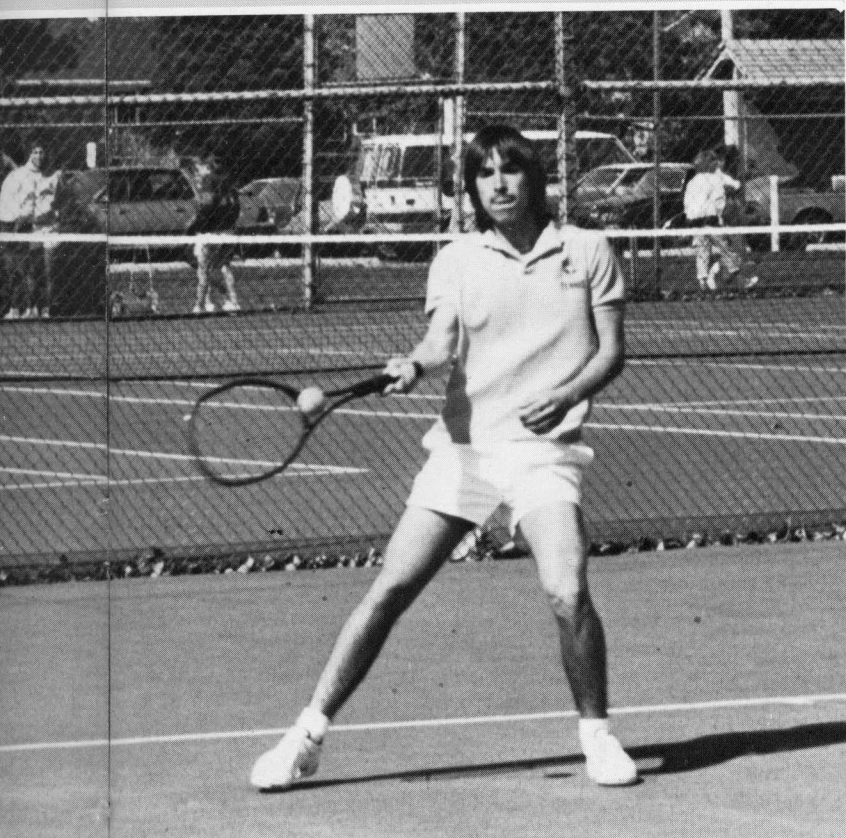

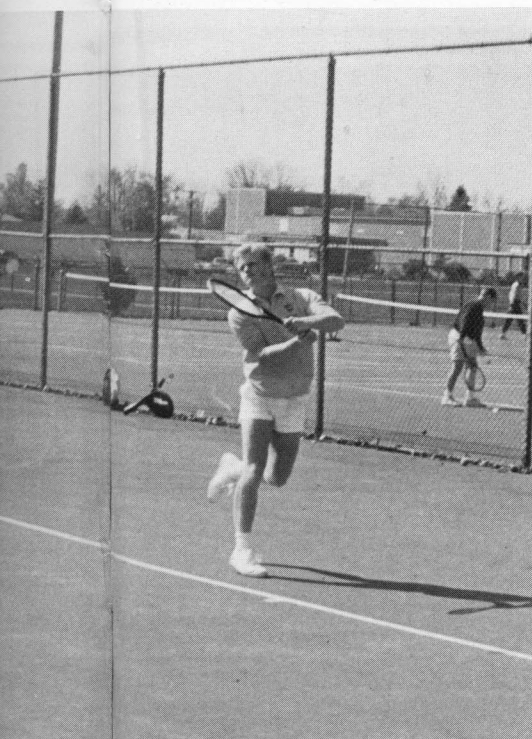

Waiting for anything to come his way, junior Todd DeChelbor prepares to return the volley.



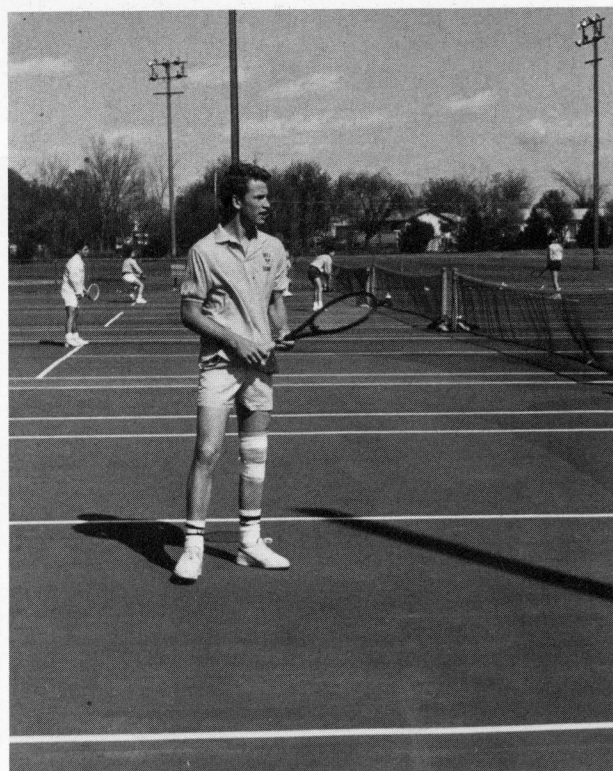
